As a memorial customer I have the right to...

- Expect my memorial to be backed by a written meaningful warranty. This warranty should protect against cracking, and changes in lettering appearance over time.
- Choose <u>a warranty that is backed by irrevocable trust.</u> This ensures my memorial 's warranty is effective for generations to come.
- Demand top quality available granite. Not second grade quality granite, craftsmanship or poor contrasting colors.
- •Have a knowledgable and experienced memorial consultant that listens to my needs and wants. Not a consultant who pushes me into a purchase I am not ready for, or one that is more than I can afford.
- •Receive an honest <u>estimated time frame for the entire process</u> through to the setting of the memorial at the cemetery.
- Be able to see and approve a computerized layout of my memorial before production, to ensure there are no surprises once the monument is placed at the cemetery.
- · A <u>consultant who is knowledgable</u> of the area's cemeteries and their regulations, and who will complete and submit any and all permit forms and affidavits needed on your behalf.
- •Expect that my <u>engraving be free of black or white paint</u>. I understand that painting letters is a shortcut that will not withstand the test of time.
